Metro draws up schedule for building park-ride lots

Metro Transit has developed a construction-priority schedule for the park-and-ride lots and Metro Flyer freeway stops to be built before 1980.

The list will be reviewed by the Metro Council Transit Committee at a special meeting to be scheduled soon.

Carle Salley, director of Metro Transit, said the list was developed to assist the Highway Department in preparing a budget that would cover its share of the project.

The Highway Department will use gasoline-tax funds to pay the local 10 per cent of the cost of parking lots and Metro Flyer freeway stops to be built on interstate highways. Federal highway funds will pay the rest.

STATE HIGHWAY funds will pay one third of the cost of those projects on other highways which will be financed by the federal Urban Mass Transportation Administration, which will pay two thirds of the cost.

Bus patrons will drive to park-and-ride lots near their home and then board express buses that will take them to work or shopping.

The park-and-ride list includes seven sites recom-

mended for immediate development. They probably would be ready for use in 1976. They include:

Near the freeway at Northgate, North City, Renton, Federal Way, White Center, North Bellevue and in Kenmore.

Some Metro Council officials are concerned about the development of another park-and-ride lot at Northgate. They believe the lot

should be farther out, beyond the city limits, because many using the existing lot on Fifth Avenue Northeast come from suburban areas.

The second-priority group, on which work will begin in 1974, include lots at Eastgate, South Bellevue, Kingsgate, Kent, Burien, Bothell and North Mercer Island.

THE THIRD group, scheduled to begin in 1975, includes lots at Newport Hills, Issaquah, Mountlake Terrace, Auburn, Des Moines and Redmond.

Included in the fourth group, proposed for the beginning of design work in 1976, are lots at Wilburton, Star Lake, Sherwood Forest, South Mercer Island and Lynnwood.

Thirty-eight Metro Flyer stops have been proposed in seven groups, ranked by priorities identified by Metro Transit.

Metro Flyer stops will be built at Freeway interchanges. Usually a special bus-only lane will be built along the Freeway right-of-way and steps and ramps will be constructed to permit passengers to walk to

the freeway stop from a local bus stop on adjacent streets.

That kind of construction would permit a bus to stop and pick up passengers quickly, without leaving the Freeway.

The highest-ranked sites in the first-priority group include Metro Flyer stops, in this order, at:

Highway 520 (the Evergreen Bridge route) and Montlake Boulevard.

At these intersections with Interstate 5 — Northeast 45th Street, Northeast Northgate Way, Northeast 130th Street, Northeast 145th Street, Northeast 185th Street and at 236th Street Southwest, Mountlake Terrace.

And at the junction of

520 and 92nd Avenue Northeast in the Clyde Hill area.

The 30 other Metro Flyer stops are proposed for construction along Interstate 405 east of Lake Washington, along a new highway from the North End of Seattle to Bothell (if it is ever built), along Interstate 5 in outlying sections of King County, along First Avenue South, Airport Way South and Highway 99.

Pair to hike from Mexico to Canada

Two New Mexico high-school students will pass through Washington on their Mexico-to-Canada hike to benefit their state heart fund.

Andy Abeyta and Roddy McDaniels of Albuquerque left the Mexican border last week. They expect to arrive in Washington about July 25, according to Washington State Heart Association spokesmen. They plan to pass through Oysterville, South Bend, Raymond, Olympia and Seattle.

The young men have received pledges from sponsors and hope to raise \$10,000 for the New Mexico Heart Fund. The Albuquerque Chamber of Commerce and the state heart associations are asking other chambers and heart associations along the route to provide meals and lodging for the young men.

2,000 to attend penal talks

More than 2,000 adult corrections and juvenile-rehabilitation officials from throughout the country will attend the American Correctional Association congress to be held August 12 to 17 in the Opera House and the Olympic Hotel.

A highlight will be a discussion on the trend toward closing juvenile correctional institutions. Other topics will include the role of the local jail in corrections, volunteers in corrections, career education in corrections, correctional research, diversion of adult offenders, corrections and the community, the emerging rights of the confined and alcoholism and the offender.

The State Department of Social and Health Services will be host. Robert Freeman, associate superintendent at the state penitentiary, will be chairman.

Jackson fears for Greek democracy

WASHINGTON — (AP) — Sen. Henry M. Jackson, Washington Democrat, yesterday called on the NATO Council of Ministers to take a formal stand in favor of greater democracy for Greece.

"The suppression of individual liberty, the lack of a genuine popular base for the Greek regime and the fissures between the government and the military all make Greece a serious problem for the alliance," he said in a prepared Senate speech.

Jackson noted that members of the North Atlantic Treaty Organization "are committed not only to the defense of each other's territory" but to "the principles of democracy, individual liberty and the rule of law."
